The Classie Lassies U10 team that captured a national championship in 2007 has been recognized by the Town of North Greenbush with a sign at the entrance to the town, Councilman Lou Desso announced.

Desso helped lead efforts to erect the sign, which is located on Main Avenue in Wynantskill near the famous Jack's hamburger stand. The team won the national championship last year, defeating previously unbeaten Elmira during tournament play in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.
